

Medicine in Society Streams at Ochsner

- **Community Health** – Baptist Community Health Services (BCHS) is a non-profit community-based health care provider that serves the primary care needs of residents in the underserved areas. Students will rotate with the entire BCHS team including the CEO, COO, physicians, APPs, nurses, etc.
- **Disadvantaged Youth** – students work at 1 of 2 local school-based health care centers working directly with the NP and medical director on adolescent care. (*Not offered in Blocks 3 or 4*)
- **Rehabilitation** – students work at the Ochsner Rehab Hospital and in PM&R clinics. You will see how recovery is managed from disease processes that cause impairments. Locations in New Orleans, Covington, and Lacombe.
- **Palliative Care** – students work with palliative care and hospice recognizing and managing all types of pain (physical, psychosocial, and spiritual). You work with the multi-disciplinary team, participate in end of life family discussions, learn strategies when communicating with patients, families, and other healthcare professionals.
- **Geriatrics** – students work with Dr. KJ Carstarphen and with Ochsner 65+ senior clinic providers to apply population health management concepts to seniors and patients with complex medical and social needs. Students will address social determinants of health and manage chronic conditions. Locations include Ochsner Main Campus and Slidell.

Global Health Options*

- **Haiti** – students spend 4 weeks prepping for 10 days in country. You do various clinics including Infectious Disease, Urgent Care, OBGYN, and Palliative Care to prepare. While in country you will see patients alongside of Drs. Yvens Laborde and Obi Nnedu. (*Only offered in Block 3*)
- **Manipal** – students spend 4 weeks in Manipal, India at Kasturba Medical College in the community medicine department. (*Only offered in Blocks 1 & 2*)
