Overview of Allocation Process

The Phase 2 Allocation Process is designed to facilitate the equitable distribution of students in each of the Clinical Placement Blocks throughout the academic year and across all available Clinical Units.

- Clinical Placements will occur on the dates as specified by the MD Academic Calendar, and do not have to be undertaken in any specific order
- Students will be allocated to a "home" Clinical Unit for the Academic Year.
 Each clinical unit includes major and peripheral teaching hospitals and facilities.
- Students will also have the opportunity to nominate their preference for allocation of the semester order



Guidelines

- The University will publish the timeframe for each stage of the Phase 2
 Allocation Process on the MD website LINK
- The Phase 2 Allocation Process may include a mechanism for Students to request one direct swap.
- Students are responsible for ensuring that their enrolment in mySI-net matches their allocated clinical placements in the placement management system.
- Students should enroll for the entire academic year. Any questions relating to your enrolment should be directed to the Student Administration Team on med.enquiries@uq.edu.au

Rural Clinical School Guidelines

- 25% of Domestic medical students attend RCS for a minimum of one academic year. Students who are regarded as domestic include:
 - Australian Citizens
 - Australian Permanent Resident
 - New Zealand Citizens
 - Permanent Humanitarian Visa Holders
- Students allocated to RCS must complete the full academic year in the Rural Clinical School.

General Practice Placement

- GP placements are organised in consultation with the Discipline Team.
- GP placements need to be organised within the dedicated placement block
- The Discipline of General Practice manages a comprehensive database of General Practitioners who
- Your clinical placement needs to be organised with the information supplied by the Discipline of General Practice, during defined timeframes which will be relayed to you by the discipline



Medicine in Society (MIS) Placement

Stream A

Domestic students will have the opportunity to nominate their preference for the allocation of their MIS placement (Stream A). This preference is irrespective of to clinical unit allocation. MIS Stream A is a Rural or Remote experience in Queensland.

Stream B

International onshore students can apply to undertake their MIS placement in their home. It is the student's responsibility to seek out a suitable placement and applications are made via the Away Rotations portal and will be forwarded to the Discipline of Rural and Remote Medicine for Academic Approval. Applications must be made in accordance with the published guidelines and timeline. Until such time as a Stream B placement is approved International Students will be allocated to a Metropolitan Stream C placement

Stream C

International onshore students who undertake MIS (Stream C) will be required to undertake their placement in a vulnerable and/or disadvantaged community. Students are required to preference from available options of Queensland Rehabilitation or Palliative Care.

Medicine in Society – Stream A



MIS (Stream A) gives you a firsthand experience of life as a rural doctor.

- When the allocations are released in WHEN?, you will not be advised of your MiS location where you will complete your 6-week rural placement
- You will have one week to preference your 6-week rural placement location at the end of September. You will be advised of your MiS allocation at the end of October.
- Information about each of the rural placements will be available on the Further information about the available placements will be made available:

- Your placement will be organised for you including a rural preceptor, community contacts and accommodation (paid for by the Discipline). The logistical details will be provided 6 weeks prior to your placement.
- Notification of placement location does not guarantee availability and changes may need to be made pending extenuating circumstance at placement locations. In these circumstances, the MiS coordinator will contact you to discuss alternative placement options.
- If you have extenuating circumstances that prevent you from undertaking a rural placement or limit your ability to travel outside of Brisbane you will need to complete a special consideration application.

Extended Placement Program EPP

Interested in rural health? Would you like the opportunity to undertake back to back placements in a rural location for the Year 3 Medicine in Society Stream A Rural & Remote Medicine and General Practice in Semester 1 or 2?



Accommodation provided free of charge and dedicated Medical Educator available to support you.

Potential locations include: *Beaudesert *Blackall, *Blackbutt, *Charleville, *Gayndah, *Gladstone, *Kilcoy, *Mt Tambourine, *Roma, *St George, *Tara, *Theodore, *Thursday Island, *Wondai, *Yeppoon.

Students wanting to participate in the program will need to be of good academic standing and have a keen interest in rural and primary care. The application process involves providing a detailed statement (maximum one page) addressing certain criteria.

Applications Open 21 May and Close 11 June.

John Flynn Placement Program (JFPP)

Option 1 - undertake your MiS placement in the same location as your JFPP and with the JFPP mentor

- Meet FOM placement guidelines
- Written approval from your Mentor for entire placement
- Submit an application prior to 21 September 2018

Option 2 - Apply to use your allocated 2018 MiS placement site for credit towards your JFPP.

- Submit an application to the Discipline of Rural & Remote Medicine at least 12 weeks prior to the commencement of the intended MIS rotation
- 2 weeks of your MIS allocation can be credited towards your JFPP.
- The Discipline will provide an approval letter for you to submit to the JFPP team.

Special Consideration

Students may seek to be assigned to a placement by the Faculty in a manner separate to the usual method of Phase 2 placement allocation, and that takes into account specific circumstances that may otherwise impact on the ability of the student to undertake placements in a specific site or order.

This is known as **Special Consideration**.

All applications for Special Consideration must be supported by evidence, will be assessed on a case-by-case basis, and will be made at the sole discretion of the Faculty.

- Allocation to a specific region; e.g. Brisbane Metropolitan region
- Request for allocation to specific site e.g. Princess Alexandra Hospital
- Applications for Special Consideration will be submitted via the Placements System
- Must include supporting documentation



Special Consideration (CONT)

Categories

- Related to health, carer responsibilities
- concurrent RHDs,
- Students approved under the PPL 3.50.07as an Elite Athlete
- Have a current UQ Access Plan

Applications for Special Consideration will be open from 7th May – 8th June 2018.

Swaps

The Phase 2 Allocation Process includes a mechanism for Students to request one direct swap.

- Students will be required to swap their allocation for the entire Academic Year.
- Partial swaps will not be considered.
- Students are responsible for locating a suitable swap

Applications

Applications will be open week commencing 23 July and will close on 29 July 2018. Please note, students are permitted 1 (one) swap application only



Away Clinical Placements

- Students of Good Academic Standing may seek to undertake, up to three
 (3) Away Clinical Placements
- Students are responsible for sourcing their own Away Clinical Placement
- Students must organise their Away Clinical Placement to match their original Clinical Placement allocation
- Once final approval for an Away Clinical Placement is provided, the original Clinical Placement allocation will be removed. If a student subsequently elects to not undertake the Away Clinical Placement, the Faculty cannot guarantee that their original Clinical Placement will be available.



Placement Management System

What is the Placement Management System

UQ has deployed a placement management system that will manage student placements across the University. Students will be able to view in real time their allocations to their clinical placements and interact with the system (e.g. tasks)

How do I preference?

Preferencing will be carried out through the University's placement management system. The system is user friendly and easy to navigate.

When there will be a tutorial?

There will be ample student resources available for students to access if required. Prior to preferencing opening students will be sent a link to log in and submit preferences.
